



Year 6 → Year 7 (Secondary) Enrolment – International Student Program (ISP)

Who this applies to: Fee-paying international students who hold a **subclass 500 (Schools Sector) student visa in their own name**. These students must use the Department's International Student Program (ISP) process and attend CRICOS-accredited government schools.

Parent steps (at a glance)

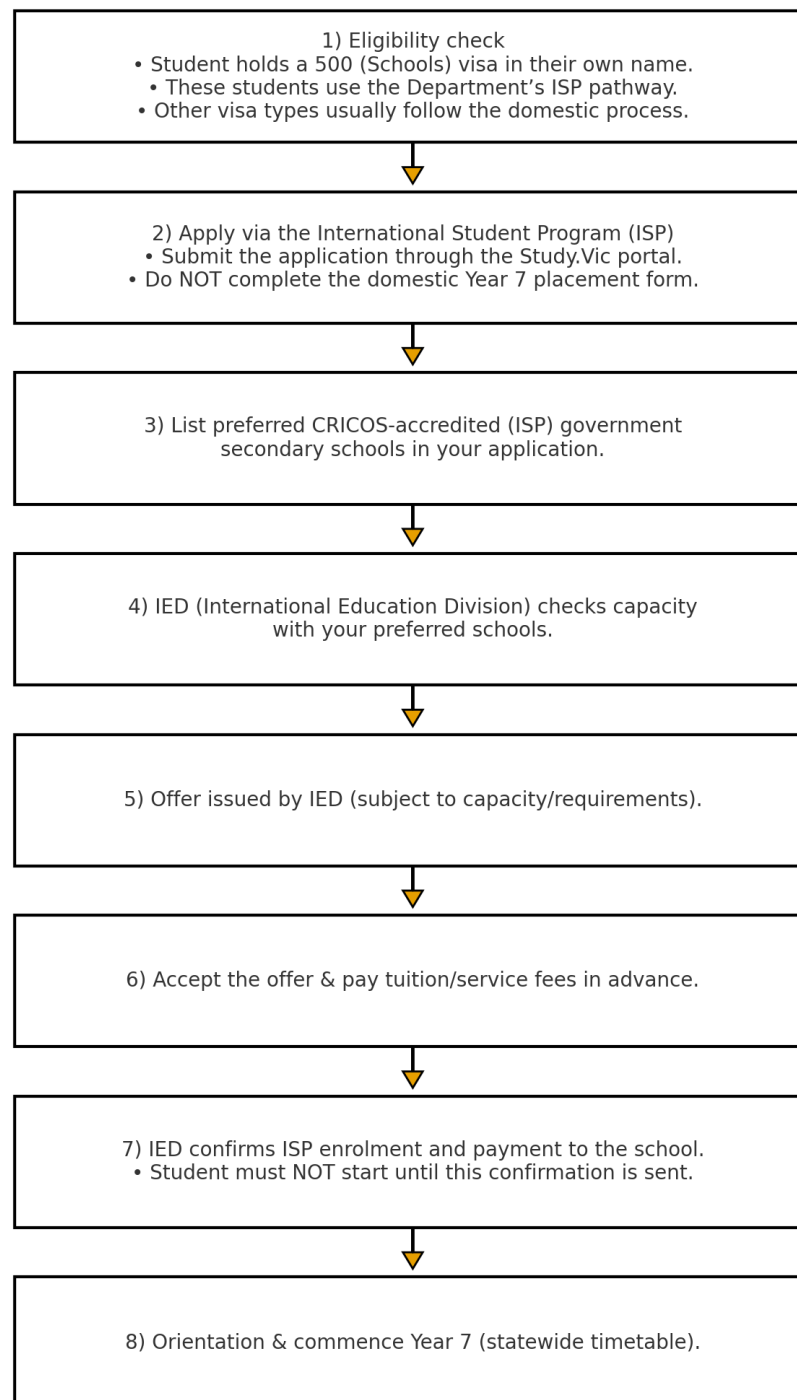
- Submit an ISP application via the Study.Vic portal, listing preferred ISP-accredited (CRICOS) secondary schools.
- The Department's International Education Division (IED) checks capacity with your preferred schools.
- If a place is available, you receive an Offer. Accept and pay tuition/service fees (in advance).
- IED confirms ISP enrolment and payment to the school; your child can then commence.
- Attend orientation and transition activities; start Year 7.

Key rules (summary)

- Fee-paying international students must not start until ISP enrolment is completed and the Department has confirmed fees are received.
- Only schools accredited for the ISP (CRICOS) can host student-visa holders in their own name.
- Student-visa holders (subclass 500 in their own name) should not complete the domestic Year 7 placement form; IED contacts families to arrange secondary enrolment.
- Some visa holders (dependents/temporary/bridging) may use the domestic Year 7 placement process.
